"This equipment will replace the use of high A ladders which are very inefficient and unsafe in the performance of much overhead maintenance work in the Central Hall and Subject Departments of the Library. The lighting fixtures, being of special design, are extremely hard to re-lamp from ladders, as is much of our other high maintenance work. The ladders must be brought in and taken out of the front doors because of their length and stored in a garage at the rear of the building, which reduces the efficiency of their use.

The Hi-Reach Telescope has a minimum height which will allow its movement through all inside building and elevator doors. Its maximum height will permit workmen to stand in a railed platform 30' .0" above floor level and work with safety, and the equipment can be stored within easy reach of the area in which it will be used for emergency work.

This equipment will be purchased from the H. B. Brown Company, 2810 Hampden Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland."

ON MOTION duly made and seconded, the Board approved the above request.

On March 23, Dr. Huntington Williams, Secretary, Maryland Postmortem Examiners Commission, wrote to the Board as follows:
