A traveler through a cotton growing district some weeks ago noticed enormous quantities of cotton piled out in the open exposed to the weather and suffering much damage. And this has occurred at a time when a destructive insect pest is doing enormous damage to the cotton crop, and when every bit of that staple needs to be preserved.

The complaint is heard almost every year that fruit is rotting on the ground in the growing districts, as it does not pay farmers to pick it at the low prices offered. Meanwhile the cities people of small means are not able to afford that fruit owing to the high prices charged.
