Those who earn good fortune by good work are apt to keep it, as it comes as a result of solid merit. Such persons make themselves indispensable, and the world pays a high price for their services.

If people are ambitious to have the use of more money, the way to get it is to plan out ways for earning it. It they deserve and merit it by their good service and exertion, it is pretty sure to come.

A person's value in the market dependent largely on the amount of supervision that he needs. If he can go ahead independently, and accomplish a great deal of well done work on his own initiative, his value is high. But if it takes a lot of costly supervision to get good work out of him, some one must constantly tell him what to do, and do his thinking for him, his value is not very much.

Also his value is reduced by errors. These may be positive breaks that he makes which some one else has to take time to repair. More frequently they are just errors of forgetfulness, and failure to do things. The man who strives for greater prosperity must not require much oversight. His work not merely must be correctly done, but he must have imagination so he can see all the possibilities of his work.


