COOLIDGE AND DAWES SWEEP THE COUNTRY

Greatest. Republican. Victory. Since The Civil War. Davis and Bryan A Very Poor

La Follette Left At The Post. Tydings Defeats Simpson.

Tuesday will go down in the history of this country generally and of the Republican party especially, as one of the greatest, elections this country has ever experienced.

Try as the candidates, that is all of them except Mr. Coolidge, may they were unable to arouse any of the old time party enthusiasm so well known to the voters of this country for many years after the Civil War when partisan feeling engendered by that memorable struggle ran high, and when seldom tickets were scratched.

That feeling, thank goodness, has passed, and men and women now weigh the candidates carefully before casting their ballots. This fact makes the overwhelming majority given Coolidge and Dawes, the Republican candidates, stand out in bold relief.
