Mill proper, operated by belt drive from 150 horse power Bruce Macbeth engine, the gas being generated by a Smith Gas producer. Rest operated by electricity, generated by a Western Electric 60 KW generator. Belt drive is used. Surplus electric energy is sold at the mill.

The system, though keeping parasites in check, is not an absolutely sure method. While the frequent changes of pasture proved beneficial. they were not entirely adequate in the control of parasites of sheep carried throughout the year. Stomach worms are among the most serious pests attacking farm flocks, and for their complete suppression some method of treatment such as dosing with dilute copper-sulphate solution is desirable. Details of the method are obtainable without cost from the Bureau of Animal Industry, United States Deton, D. C.
