

SEC. 159. If any person shall place anything, or cause anything to be placed, on any railroa in this State, calculated to obstruct, overthrow or direct from the track of such railroad any on such railroad, or shall break or injure any manner any railroad in this State, with car, vehicle or carriage, such person so offending shall be deemed guilty of felony, and upon conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to the penitentiary for not less than two years nor

SEC. 160. If the death of any person shall h occasioned by the overthrow or obstruction of any railroad car, vehicle or carriage, produced by the placing of any thing or obstruction on any railroad, or by breaking or injuring any railroad, or any bridge attached thereto, in violation of the preceding section, then the person so placing the thing, or obstructing, or breaking or injuring, shall be deemed guilty The above law will be rigidly enforced so as it relates to railroads under the contro of the Kent County Railroad Company.
