The river is falling rapidly, and the boating season on the upper waters will soon be over until the rains come. One large landholder has 300,000 bushels in the valley, and having no prospect of getting it to market at present, is making arrangements to store it in temporary sheds, where it will remain until another season. This necessi ty may not work any special hardship for men of large means who are in no hurry to realize; but farmers who are in debt, and are paying heavy interest need the full money value of their wheat at once Most of these can obtain advances, but many such have already anticipated this advantage and now want the balance t make ends meet. The grain product this year in California is in excess of all the means of transportation.


