PEDESTRIANISM.

Weston set out in New York to walk five hundred miles in six days. He has failed to do it, but he came within seventy miles of success. He gave up the task when he had accomplished four hundred and thirty miles within the time specified. It is certain that he showed pluck and enfeat of walking one hundred and fifteen miles within twenty-four hours, was accomplished on Monday in nine minutes and two seconds less than the specified time. There is no record of an equal to this achievement ever having been accomplished by the best trained athletes, and it must be placed among the marvels of physical endurance. In see ing to find proof of pedestrians doing as well as Weston did, the New York Times first adduces the case of Foster Powell, who is said to have walked, in 1788, from London to York and back again in one hundred and forty hours; a distance of three hundred and ninety-six miles by coach road. But Powell's performance rests only on tradition, and even if it were a fact, it has been beaten by Weston, who has averaged about seventy-four miles per day, while Powell averaged less than that. Captain Barclay and Richard Marks are proved to have walked a thousand miles in a thousand hours, but Weston's average is also
