HORRIBLE PRODUCT OF NATURE-THE DEVI

FISH OF THE VEGETABLE KINGDOM

If you can imagine a pineapple eight feet high and thick in proportion, resting upon its base and denuded of leaves, you will have a good idea of the trunk of the tree, which however, was not the color of anana, but a dark, dingy brown, and apparently as hard as iron. 
