The revised statutes of the United States authorize each of the States to determine how any vacancy in its electoral college may be filled, and even without such authorization the legislature of each State has clearly the right, under the constitution, to make provisions for such a case. All but four States are stated to have made provisions by law for such a contingency, the four States which have neglected to do this being Colorado, Nevada, Louisiana and Florida. In those States a vacancy is not guarded against. The electoral college could not fill its own vacancies, for it is not a corporation, and no elector has any authority beyond the casting of his own vote, which, under the Boots & Shoes,




