TO MAKE YOUR OWN BAKING POWDER. -Put half a pound of ground rice into a bowl, mix well together and then add three ounces of pure tartaric acid. Both soda and acid must be freed from lumps, by crushing with a broad-bladed knife or a spoon on a piece of paper. When the rice, soda and acid are well mixed, sift the mixture through a wire sieve or a fine gravy strainer, and put it in a tin; two small tins are best, as one can be kept shut up and free from air, wnile the other tin is in use. All baking powders being composed of ingredients that effervesce when in contact with moister of any kind, the tins should have a close-fitting poonful to each pound of flour. This C. W. 


