Mr. CHAR. T. HOWARD, the well-known chief of the Louisiana Lottery Company, died at his residence near Dobbs Ferry, N. Y., Sunday last, from injuries received in being thrown from a horse. It is said the stockholders divide about \$2,000,000 per year from the operations of the lottery.

The grand jury in New York on Wednesday found an indictment for grand larceny against Ferdinand Ward. The indictment charges Ward with grand larceny in the first degree in carrying away from the Marine Bank a short time since in suspension a bag containing \$1,500,000 worth of bonds and securities.

A strike of iron and steel workers was inaugurated on the last instant and is one of the most extensive ever entered upon in this country. Only ten out of the thirty-eight iron and steel mills of Pittsburgh are working, while similar strikes at Wheeling, Youngstown, Cleveland, Cincinnati, Chicago and St. Louis are at a standstill. It is estimated that nearly one hundred thousand men and boys will be thrown out of employment, and as that means short commons and greater or less distress and want to half a million of people the outlook is gloomy enough. It is very much to be regretted that no amicable arrangement between the employers and employed could have been made.

SHOCKING TRAGEDY IN CECIL. A dreadful family affair—worse of a shotgun in the hands of a maniac.

The quiet community of Woodlawn was convulsed last Saturday morning by a tragedy which has no equal in the annals of Cecil county. Charles P. Barnes, aged 42 years, a farmer and dealer in hay, grain and agricultural implements, residing about 200 yards from Woodlawn, killed Thos. E. Brown, aged 35 years, who resided one mile from Woodlawn, and immediately afterwards shot to death his own eldest son, James Arthur Barnes, aged 13 years, and then shot his second son, Ernest, aged 10 years, wounding him in the forehead. Mr. Brown was a nephew of the homicide, and they married sisters. Mr. Brown married Lizzie, and James Arthur Barnes, daughter of Mr. James Toulson, formerly a well-to-do farmer of that county, but who for the last two years has resided in Wilmington, Delaware.

Charles P. Barnes had been for some years very successful in business, and had accumulated a nice property. He had been married to a girl who gave way to his appetites the last two years previous to the shooting, and she had become a drunkard, which seemed to prey on his mind.
