In speaking of the doctrine of States' "In the framing of the Constitution there was one fatal neglect, which was the cause of much bitter contention and ultimately deluged the country with blood. The rights of the States are not clearly defined. Although we believe for Men and Boys at ½ to ‡ usual that the United States Government should be the centre of a system around which the States, like planets should revolve, we think the planets, while yet acknowledging the central power,

should be allowed to mark out their own orbits. The power of the general government is arbitrary; if it should come into your own State and take away from your municipality the right of selecting a mayor, you would have no recourse but appeal, and if your appeal should not be heard, you would have no recourse but war, and you will never go to war. We believed in the South in the right of any State to withdraw from the federation. But that question has been settled in the negative forever. Thank God, we don't have to leave it to our children to settle. We have no thought in Virginia now, except to lift her up to be one of the brightest jewels in the coronet upon the brow of the Union." The Governor then finished his address with a beautiful peroration on white-winged peace spreading her protecting wings over the country from the rock-ribbed coast of the Atlantic to where the placid waves of the Pacific played upon the golden sands of the Western coast.
