KANSAS CITY CRAZY.
The Real Estate Boom Unsettling the Mind
of Missouri's Rushing Town.

"It is enough to unsettle one's mind to
stay a day in Kansas City," said a commo-
dial traveler. "They have the real estate
boom in the most virulent type. Every-
body is getting rich out of real estate. Prop-
erty is doubling in value in six months.
Last year and held at \$150 an acre,

in travel; came back and sold out for \$20,
pointed out to you as a chap that has made
\$10,000 in real estate in the last year and a
half; it is pretty hard to stay in Kansas
City without getting the fever. Of course
real estate agents are thicker than flies in a
hole of you and talk you into buying some-
thing. I know dozens of traveling men
who have got the craze while there and in-
vested all the money they had on earth. It
is no uncommon occurrence, they tell me,
for men from the East to arrive in Kansas
City to attend to some legitimate business,
but getting the craze almost before they
have written their names on the register,
jump into a carriage and ride out to look at
some lots, telegraphing home for money,
and letting their business go to the dogs.
