





#### GRAND JURY REPORT

KENT NEWS, CHESTERTOWN, MARYLAND

Statement Verified - Recommend Itemized Reports.

The Grand Jury made the following

To the Hon. Judges of the Circuit Court for Kent County, Maryland.

We, the Grand Jury for Kent county. for the October term of 1912, beg leave to make the following report: We have been in session five days: have carefully considered 35 cases: have had the three constables of the county before us; have examined 74 witnesses, for a few of whom we have issued summons; have made 30 presentments and

found 29 true bills. We would recommend the different Treasurers of the funds for political purposes to be more careful in the future o render their reports in itemized form concerning all expenditures and receipts,

in compliance with the law. We also recommend that the Pennsylvania Railroad Co.'s attention be called to the crossing at Lambson and Massey stations, and others that need repairs

and danger signals. We made a visit to the jail and inspected the whole premises and the different cells inside. We found 26 prisoners, whose quarters were comfortable and clean. On the whole, w congratulate ourselves that we have done our best to bring to justice every violator of the law, whether the offence be a crime

or a misdemeanor. We further recommend that the Board of County Commissioners for Kent county appropriate sufficient funds to aid the State's Attorney in securing assistance in the prosecution of his duties in apprehending and convicting violators of the local option law. We thank the State's Attorney and officers of the court for their courtesy and assistance in the performance of

#### WILSON SAVED THE GAME.

Ex-Gov. Glenn Tells Voters of Stirring Baseball at College.

In a dramatic manner former Gover-I nor Robert B. Glenn, of North Carolina, Friday night described to 600 voters of the Ninth ward, Baltimore, how Woodrow Wilson as a youth won a game of baseball for Davidson College, North

Mr. Glenn, who was a classmate of the Presidential candidate, was a pitcher on Davidson's crack team, while Governor Wilson, who, said the former Goverernor, was a 'long lean, but fleet-footed youth," was left fielder.

Davidson was playing its strongest rival and in the last half of the ninth inning, with the opposing team up, the score stood 4 to 3 in favor of Davidson. \* The opponents had a man on first and second, with two out, and next batsman was the strongest on the opposing team. The former Governor said that he made up his mind to give the batter four bad balls and take his chances with the next batsman, who was weak. He threw a ball wide of the plate, and to his surprise the batsman stepped out \* and hit it fairly.

With the crack of the ball Wilson started after it. Nobody believed that he could get it, but just as it got over his head he leaped several feet in the air and the ball hit his glove. It stuck The game was over and Woodrow Wilson won it, and incidentally Mr. Glenn said he saved his reputation as a

His hearers closely followed every tail of the narrative and applauded the finale just as if they were witnessing the events related by Mr. Glenn. As a classmate, Mr. Glenn described Governor Wilson's struggle through

ner Mr. Glenn discussed the issues of amusing but opportune stories which swept the audience off its feet.

His sincerity in discussing the tariff and the trusts impressed his hearers and at times they seemed spelbound. At the close the audience arose and cheered for several minutes.

Mr. Glenn declared that the Democrats not only have the advantage as to candi lates but also in issues. He discussed the profits of the trusts and the wages paid the laboring classes by the protected industries.


