THE POTATO CANKER CAUSES ALARM.

New Jersey Growers Warned to Keep Close Vigil For The Disease Among Tubers.

of potato canker. He says that so far the disease which has broken out abroad among potatoes has not struck New Jersey, but he made a study of it while in Washington, and is preparing warnings to the New Jersey farmers, so that it may be kept out of this State. So tions of potatoes from Canada and Europe have been stopped. Secretary Wilson told Mr. Dye that last week 400 bags of potatoes from Germany were confiscated in the port of New York, and there is an embargo on foreign potatoes. This leads Mr. Dye to suggest to the farmers of the State the advisability of and the suggested belief that before the winter is over potatoes will be selling like diamonds in price in this State.

"Last year we imported 12,000,000 bushels of potatoes," said Mr. Dye, "and I cannot see how the price of market here, besides sending many million bushels abroad, where the disease has made such ravages. The Jersey farmer has this opportunity before him with others. He can put in more potatoes next year, or at least as many as he did this year, and if the yield is as fine as it has been this year, he can buy another automobile or put the equivalent in the bank. The Jersey potato is free from the foreign canker, and we propose to keep it so. Every effort of this department, including the scientific work of the experiment station, will be put forth to prevent this canker getting in the lersey notate. We have too fine a the Jersey potato. We have too fine a crop this year to let anything stand in the way of its duplication next," The foreign carker starts at the eye of

the potato, and gradually disintegrates the potato until it looks in the end like a coarse sponge, and, of course, worthless. In Canada, the concealment of the disease is punishable by law.
