The express company has made enough to quit, but I was not making a good square living at first and now I am working for nothing and feeding myself. I wouldn't mind working three more years for nothing but the feed is about out.

"Can't you make some arrangements about this thing? You know they should not add the express business to ny mail contract. If you know of any relief study it up and write me. I know that Uuncle Sam doesn't want one of his hard working citizens to do the express companies business for nothing. I am willing to do the work if you will get me a pair of mules and a wagon, and something to feed the mules.

"See the man who handles the money up there, and ask him if he will raise my wages, or cut McIntyre and Irwinton off from the post business."
