



111 3-8 BUSHELS SHELLED CORN PER ACRE.

Remarkable Success in Growing Large Crops of Maryland Twin Corn-Helpful Advice To Farmers.

duced with me, 110 bushels of shelled corn per acre. In 1911 the same corn yielded at the rate of 96 bushels per acre. This was done in the face of the most unfavorable conditions of the weather, 1911 being the dryest year ever known in this section. In 1912 this same corn yielded 112 3-8 bushels of shelled corn per acre. In each instance it was actual measurement and not guess work. The above results was without the use of manure or fertilizer. In 1912 I offered two premiums as against one the two years preceding. Lee Hall, of Pocomoke City, Md., his guess being 118 bushels.

Scarcity of farm help is a stern reality so with us, therefore it has become ne. clothes will cessary to cultivate less acres and produce more to the acre. It must be the cleaner, fresher and object of every corn grower to grow large crops on less acreage. The secret of wear longer. this is to secure the right kind of seed. plant less acreage, take proper care of the seed bed and the plant.

To win prizes at seed shows you must have fine samples. This can be very well done from corn producing only 10 boiling to 20 bushels per acre.

The average person, however, is not growing corn for exhibition, except perhaps in a local way, but f r what it represents in dollars and cents. Instead fashioned of growing it for the best specimens of a few ears, I am impressed that it is a heap more desirable to secure the greatest number of bushels per acre. Therefore the variety of seed corn that will made for that. produce the largest number of bushels to the acre, is what our farmers are interested in. more dollars. Many a farmer handicaps himself by refusing to believe that his neighbor has a better strain or variety of seed corn than does himself. Plant seed best suited to the soil and climate and the






