For drop letters (not to be mailed) For any printed circular, handbill,

or advertisement, (unsealed) sent any distance.

For any pamphlet or other matter "of any kind," that is "transmittable by mail," and has no written communication, of one ounce or less, or for a newspaper exceeding 1,900 square inches of surface, 21 " For each additional ounce, or an excess greater than a half ounce, 1 "
