COWARD ASSAULT -- SEVERAL PERSONS SHOT .- On Monday night, about 8 o'clock as a party of the members of the New Market Fire Company, were returning from a tance beyond the Long Bridge over Gwynn's Falls, by a gang of some twenty. persons rallying under the names of Poly. wogs." A volley of fire arms was receiv. ed from the fences and bushes on the road side, behind which their assailants were secreted, awaiting their approach. A young man named John Bevan, who resides in Paca street, received a shot in the eye; which will cause the loss of that organ; Geo. Craig received a bad wound in of the back of head from a slug; Geo. Allen was slightly wounded in the back by a ball: and a young man named James Myers, who was on horseback, was knocked off. the animal he rode being badly wounded with shot. Another young man whose name we did not learn, was shot under the arm, and several others were more or less injured. The New Market boys was all in vihicles, or on horseback at the time. and the animals being wounded and alarmed, ran off in several instances. We understand some few shots were returned with pistols, but whether any of the assail-12 lants were injured is not known. It was a cowardly affair, and the perpetrature S44 should be ferreted out and punished. What makes it so much more aggravated, there were females in company, one or two of whom were so slarmed that they fainted, but luckily receried no injured from the missiles .- Clipper.


