Concealed Weapons on Election

The following Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session of 1874, and approved April 6, 1874, is publish ed for the information of the public: To prevent carrying of guns, pistols, dirks, dirk-knives, razors, billies or bludgeons by American. any person in Kent. Queen Annes or Montgomery counties on the day of election in SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General
