



### DIOCESAN CONVENTION.

Interest in the forty-third annual convention of the Protestant Episcopal Diocese of Easton, which meets Christ Church the first Tuesday June, is great, and arrangements for the entertainment of the delegates are now about completed. One gratifying feature of this part of the arrangement is that members of all denominations have come forward and asked the privilege of assisting in the entertainment of

The convention will open on Tuesday, June 6, after morning prayer and sermon at 9.30. The convention sermon will be preached by the Rev. Walter B Stehl, rector of St. Paul's Parish, Centreville, one of the most eloquent preachers in the diocese. Immediately after organization the bishop will appoint the convention committees and the business of the meeting will begin.

The officers of the diocese are: Bishop Adams, president; secretary, Rev. E. R. Rich; assistant secretary, Rev. W. N. Weir, of Kent Island; chancellor, Hon. James Alfred Pearce, Chestertown; registrar, Rev. Henry Davies, Easton; treasurer of conventiou, Hon. William H. Adkins, Easton; treasurer of diocesan board, Col. Henry Hollyday, , Easton; treasurer diocesan clergy relief, Mr. Edward B. Hardcastle, Eas-

Among the committees to report are Missions, composed of Mr. William Reddie, Col. Henry Hollyday, Jr., Rev. T. B. Barlow, of Cambridge; Rev. J. F. Kirk, St. Michaels; Rev. J. F. Kirk, St. Michaels; Rev. W. N. Weir, Stevensville. This committee disburses annually nearly \$4,000.

This convention will be called upon to finally settle several long-standing questions, among which are the proposed merging of the diocesan clergy relief! fund of nearly \$15,000 with the general fund and the proposed division of North Elk Parish and the creation of a new parish out of it, to be called Susque hanna Parish. Several important alternations in the church canons will be so lalso taken up.

The Diocese of Easton, embracing the entire Eastern Shore, has about 10,000 | \* parishoners, 38 parishes with a property value of \$500,000. The total contributions during the past year will probably exceed, \$50,000.

HICKS FOR JUNE. Whilst we have been sweltering, broiling and sizzling all through the month of May, with practically little relief from rainfall, Rev. Irl R.
