Let us take the famous star Arc. Almighty is represented as saying to the unfortunate patriarch, who mainhelplessness and his sufferings, "Canst

thou call forth Arcturus and his sons?" Many conflicting measures of the parallax of Arcturus bave been made. but the latest made at Yale seem more probably correct than their predecessors. They fix the parallax at 0.066 seconds-i. e., sixty-six one-thousandth of a second of arc. From this it is easy to calculate the distance of the star. It comes out at nearly 290,000,- 1 000,000,000 miles (two hundred and ninety trillion miles). This is more the earth from the sun.

Having this distance, we can calculate the actual amount of light shed by Arcturus, or, in other words, its actual brightness as compared with that of our sun, on the supposition that both were at the same distance from
