# The Best Kind of Family and Dairy

A correspondent writes to the Ameriican Agricu'turist: "The subject that probably interests more of your readers than almost any other is, 'what is the most desirable kind of cows for family use and dairy purposes. In other words, what breed will produce the most value in milk, butter and cheese, on a given amount of feed?' I will give you my experience for what it is worth. I have tried nearly all the various breeds. Alderneys, Ayrshires, Short Horns, Madagascars, and natives, and I became satisfied, some six years ago, that Alderneys gave the richest milk and produced the desirable cow for all purposes. The Ayr- er and Foot Mortising, Moulding and Tennonshires are of good size, extremely hardy, We solicit your Orders. and good milkers, but the quality of milk is no better than Devons, natives, etc.; but cross the Alderneys with them and you get a hardy animal, with the rich milking qualities of the Alderney. You increase the size over the thorough-bred Chester River Alderney. Half Alderney and half Ayrshire is, I think, the very best cow extant. 
