Congress has before it a bill to provide vocational training in all the high schools of the country. The bill was introduced simultaneously in both Houses by Senator Hoke Smith and Representative Hughes, both of Georgia. It is an elaboration of the federal aid system by which the United States government annually contributes nearly \$100,000 to each State for the maintenance of agricultural colleges and experiment stations, as well as \$4,100,000 to carry on the rural extension system of vocational instruction for farmers throughout the country. The position of the farmer of the future will be equalled by few and surpassed by none in this country. The ascendancy of the agriculturist will be challenged by none in the years to come.
