THE WEIGHT OF CORN.—Some days ago and inquiry was made through the Baltimore market as to the legal weight of a barrel of corn in the ear. As many of our farmers are disposing of corn in the ear we publish the reply of the Sen, which will be found correct by reference to Acts of Assembly of 1882. The Sen makes the following reply: The act of 1882, chapter 294, provides that corn in the ear may be bought and sold by weight or measure, and when sold by weight 35 lbs. shall be the standard weight of a barrel.
