RICH BURIED TREASURE. Where They Abund in Maryland—The Marl Deposits. Baltimore American.

That God in His wisdom has made the most bountiful provision for every want of man for all time is a truism that meets with constant verification. When some years ago, as some of us well remember, the serious fact was realized that our supply of firewood in this country was nearly exhausted, and that the rapidly increasing population would soon be in a dilemma for means of warming their houses and cooking their food, then it was that most wonderful, excellent and valuable substitute, coal, was discovered.

It is found at a depth of about five feet below the surface, extending from fifteen to twenty feet down, and lies under a bed of gravel some eighteen inches or two feet in thickness. It also contains fossils, bones and shark's teeth of great size. The task and some of the molars of an immense elephant or mastodon, found there some years ago, by George B. Westcott, Esq., of Kent county, were presented by him to the Maryland Academy of Science, and are now on exhibition there.
