On Saturday of last week President Cleveland issued an order consolidating the Internal Revenue District of Delaware with the Maryland District. A large number of Districts throughout the country were similarly consolidated. The order will go into effect in June. It is claimed that this action will save a large amount of money to the government.

The President accompanied by Mrs. Cleveland, Mr. and Mrs. Lamont, and a party of select friends, left Washington on Thursday last for the Adirondack region, where they will spend a few days in recreation upon the shores of Saranac Lake. It is expected that the President will return to Washington on the 5th of June, and that he will spend the summer months at his country residence.

The National Drill - The President Takes a Trip.

WASHINGTON, May 30, 1887.- Regarding the difficulty that was encountered in attempting a detailed account of the great National Drill, even were the space allotted much greater than that afforded by the columns of a newspaper, I will not attempt to discuss the subject in detail. The gentlemen constituting the committee which, a few months since, conceived of, and have since carried into execution, the details of so stupendous an undertaking as that involved in the bringing together in friendly competition the representative military organizations of thirty-one States and Territories, may justly feel proud of the success of their undertaking.

The space surrounding the Washington Monument covered with its white tents, rendered brilliant by the varied uniforms and regimental colors of the various organizations represented, and the scene enlivened by the strains of martial music, serve to recall the days of 1861 and '62, when, as now, the streets of the National Capital echoed to the tread of marching regiments. From Oregon to Maine and from Wisconsin to Texas, nearly every State in the Union, sent her quota to the Drill, and whatever the decision of the judges may be as to the relative merits of the various organizations, it may be truthfully said that without a single exception, every one of the sixty companies present at the Drill presented a creditable appearance both in camp and upon the drill ground, and the Nation may be justly proud that in her citizen soldiery she possesses a standing army which will compare favorably, if not in point of numbers, at least in proficiency in military discipline, with the expensive standing armies of foreign nations.

The exhibition drills of the various zouave companies were, to the general public, the most interesting of all the exhibitions given by the visit-companies. The manner in which the various fancy movements, wheeling, marching, bayonet and skirmish drills were executed, were wonderful. One of their feats - the scaling of a fifteen-foot fence - was, perhaps, the most difficult yet attempted upon a drill ground. At the word of command they broke for the fence, rapidly formed a pyramid, tossed up and passed over their guns, and with cat-like agility followed themselves. When but two men remained, and the spectators were guessing out a way of saving them, one jumped upon the shoulders of the other, thence to the top of the fence, and there turned about and helped up his fellow.

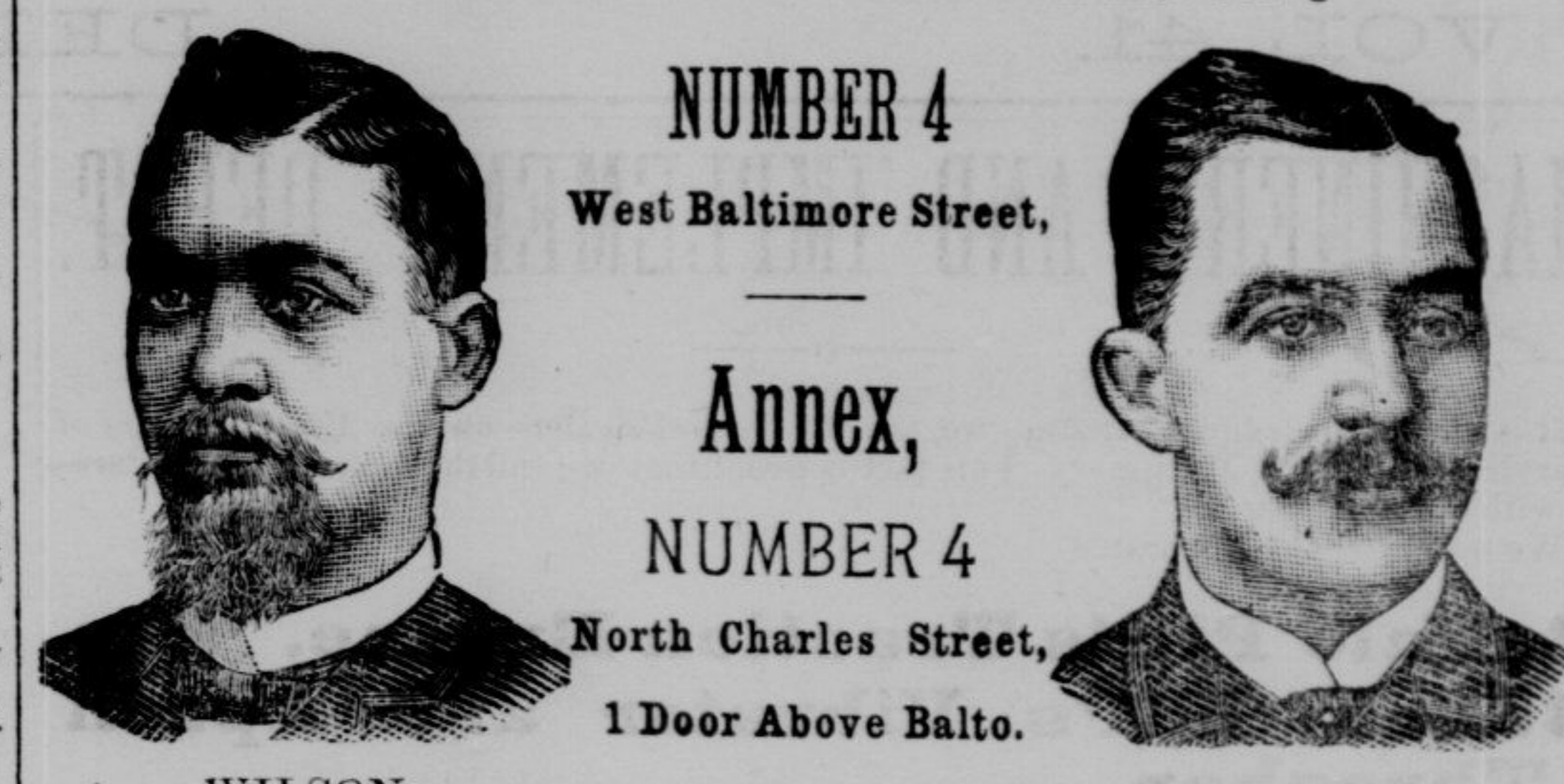
