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PUBLIC LOCAL LAWS.

[PUBLISHED BY AUTHORITY.] CHAPTER 187. AN ACT giving the owner or owners of a station in Worcester, St. Mary's, Anne Arundel, Caroline and Western counties, a lien upon the roadway of said station for one year from the date of failure of said program.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the owner or owners of any station on the roadway of said station for one year from the date of failure of said program...
