

THE DEMOCRATIC STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE met at Barron's Hotel, Baltimore, on Wednesday. It was decided to hold the State convention, to nominate a candidate for comptroller, on September 12.

On September 11 Baltimore city will nominate candidates for the General Assembly. A candidate for chief justice of the third judicial circuit will be chosen at Towson on August 7.

A committee on resolutions, of which Hon. George W. Covington was chairman, among other things stated that the party, by its representatives, demands that the registration of the voters of the State and the elections held thereunder shall be of unquestionable fairness.

The party also demands that the primary elections shall honestly represent the choice of the party, and recalls the efforts to this end inaugurated by the central committee in 1887.

The report calls especial attention to the fact that whilst the registration of the negro voters in Baltimore city increased from 11,744 in 1887 to 12,959 in 1888, or 10 per cent, that the white voters increased only from 73,145 in 1887 to 77,475 in 1888, or 6 per cent.

In the State, inclusive of Baltimore city, the increase of the negro registration was from 47,122 in 1887 to 49,532 in 1888, or 5 per cent, whilst that of the whites increased only from 1,992,251 in 1887 to 1,996,659 in 1888, or 1/4 of 1 per cent.

Attention is likewise called to the further fact that while the electors of Mr. Cleveland received in 1884 96,866 votes, they received in 1888 105,168 votes, a natural and gratifying increase of 9,302 votes.

That whilst the electors for Mr. Blaine received in 1884 85,548 votes, Mr. Harrison received in 1888 99,936 votes, an increase of 14,388 votes, thus exhibiting a disproportion in the increase of the vote of the two parties which can in the main be attributed to an excessive registration of negroes; and this committee calls upon all Democrats to assist in an effort to legally correct the registration lists of the State, to secure full and fair elections thereunder, and it especially urges upon them to take an active part in all primary elections, in order that only proper nominations be made for office.
