THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT. In an interview in the Maryland Democrat and Journal Col. David G. McIntosh, President of the Maryland State Bar Association, says:

"If this be so, and if the interests of good government and society would be promoted by the restriction of this suffrage, what is the duty of a good citizen? Should he decline to assist in bringing about the end which he admits to be deis being engineered by selfish men for political purposes? Should he not ask himself which is the greater, and which should be considered as of more value, a general and enduring good or a temporary advantage he thinks will result to those whom he distrusts or may not like. Should he allow the gratification of his personal feelings to outweigh all other

considerations? "Should a man who honestly thinks unrestricted suffrage an evil, when an opportunity is presented to get rid of it, as far as possible, allow himself to be dipersonal objection to some of the people connected with it, or because it is not presented in exact conformity with his views, or because, perhaps, the educational tests may be thought too difficult or the property qualification too high? Are these not mere incidents about which many of us differ and have our own opinion, but should they suffer us to lose sight of the greater and larger object in view?"

Every course of Demo cracy upon its economic doctrines is now vindicated by the very enemy who had been assailing it. 




