EDITORIAL NOTES. The costly market basket and the high prices of living generally is the paramount issue this year—a Congressional election being at hand. The Baltimore Sun gives this pertinent information to chairman Hanna, of the Republican State Central Committee, who wants to interject State issues—wants to drag a herring across the trail of sly old g. c. p. reynard which is about to be bagged. Says the Sun: "Everybody knows, on the contrary, that the main issue is the Payne-Aldrich tariff. "Supremacy of the Federal Constitution" is good, but the average voter is looking to the artificial prices of things, to the trusts fostered by high-tariff rates and to the failures of the Republican majority in the House and Senate at Washington to redeem the tariff promises of the last national platform. President Taft's attempts to defend the monstrosity of the Payne-Aldrich act have offended the national conscience, and the people will wish to know in the next Congressional elections not how the Democrats fell short at Annapolis, but what the candidates for Congress are going to do about tariff reform. This is an issue that will not down. The Republicans of this State will make a sad mistake if they think they can avoid it and be faithful stand-patters. The people now know what hurts them and will stand no more fooling. They want lower prices. And they won't have dust thrown in their eyes in the shape of partisan State issues."

That is the best way to increase the purchasing power of their money, to equalize taxation and to compel the monopolists to disgorge at least a part of the enormous profit which they are licensed to exact from the people.
