EDITORIAL NOTES.

Fourth of July orators, gloritying the great achievements of the founders of our country and its cherished institutions, breathing a love for the naitants, admonishing the citizen that these things should be handed down to generations yet unborn, unimpaired and secure, are always popular with the thoughtful and the good. They touch the heart and awaken the conscience and give a higher value, the true value, to the inheritance from the fathers. These sentiments should not be allowed to slumber too long-to ever give place to the superficial, the spectacular display becoming so general all over the country, in these latter-day celebrations of the nation's birthday. Real patriotism would be found a most fruitful field for greatest sermons and most eloquent orations as in the days of yore. Such treatment would tend to free this beautiful land from full many a noxious growth which mars its beauty and menaces its political health, even if its foundations are not endangered.

In closing his recent speech in Congress on connivance of the Republican leaders and the sugar trust Mr. Covington of Maryland said the people now realize that there is "no hope for relief from oppression and monopoly at the hands of the Republican yarty; it has cemented too close a partnership with the predatory corporate interests.
