Still Around

How important is coal to this country? A few facts released by the National Coal Association help to answer that question.

Coal accounts for twothirds of the fuel used by cur utility companies to pro duce power. It is the source of twice as much electricity all our hydroelectric plants.

Enough coal to produce 51,000,000 autos was burned last year by the steel industry.

During the current year, the soft coal mines will spend more than \$500 million for equipment, repair parts, and operating materials. This money flows into industries and payrolls in every section of the country.

Coal from a single state, Kentucky, is used in at least 30 of the states and in most European countries west of the Iron Curtain.

Our atomic energy plants will soon be using more than 23,000,000 tons of coal each year.

Since 1900 our total coal consumption has doubled. Many forecasts say that it is likely to double again in the next 25 years.

Pages could be filled with facts of a similar character. Coal has been around for a long time. Research coupled with a progressive coal industry and a growing nation are making it steadily more valuable.

Tax reduction is a problem facing every branch of it can be accomplished now, in others it must be temporarily deferred.





Winand, named Convention Chariman by State President Jas. C. Morton, Jr., is a member of the Law Student Club of Baltimore, served as former president of that club.


