Ten years ago Tuesday the first shell of the World War was fired, and Europe was started on the path which has led, far and fast, to her present situation. Thrones have fallen and boundaries have been switched about in that brief de. cade. Great nations, have been humbled to the dust and new ones have sprung into being. Countless lives have been sac rificed to battle, famine and disease. For many more the reasonable security of civilized life has been transformed to a grim, uncertain struggle for mere existence. In the whole span of human existence there are few instances where a decade has seen a greater shatter. ing of co operative achievement than that now closed The ten years past will be remembe ed. and remembered with horrow and amaz ment, long after

been forgotten. They were not all spent in fighting, these ten strange years. More than half of them have been years of nominal peace, but peace shadowed over by hatreds, passions and angry enmities scarcely less destructive than those of the war itself. In a sense the time since 1918 has been one of greater waste than the fifty months of battle. These latter years have seen the blasting of ideals, the slow decay of that fine spirit which made the youth of every belligerent nation march blithely forth to Armageddon. The catchwords of the war ring strangely now, so overlaid they are with what has happened since. It was a war "to make the world safe for democracy."


