

Superstitious Sallors Wanted Commander Consigned to Sea-Others Would Carry Corpse to Port.

A weird tale of shipwreck, death at sea, and the fierce, rough-and-tumble battles of superstitious, hard-fisted seafaring men was revealed when Attorney John R. Tyrrell filed for probate in the superior court the will of Capt. Charles D. Olsen, master of the clipper ship James Rolph, Jr., the San Francisco Chronicle states.

With him on the voyage were his wife, their eight-year-old daughter, and the child's nurse. After his death certain members of the crew insisted that he should be buried at sea.
