Massanutten Defends Interscholastie Title Against Tome Drive

Three Records Broken And One Equaled In Tests In B. A. C. Pool

From the Baltimore Sunday Sun) Swimmers of the Massanutten Military Academy, of Woodstock, Va., successfully defended their laurels in the annual interscholastic swimming championships sponsored by the Baltimore

Athletic Club last Saturday night. The honors of a successful defense of their team title gained last year was so stubbornly contested by Tome School that there was considerable discussion at the close. This latter resulted from a diversity of opinion regarding the scoring system used. The final official decision, however, gave Massanutten 511/2 points to win the event, with Tome

finishing second with 471/2 points. It was a night filled with stirring happenings as the boys fought desperately while the tide in the point score seesawed up and down, with first Tome and then Massanutten setting the point

Three Records Broken

During this completion three existing records were wiped off the books, one was equaled and a new mark for a new distance (40-yard dash) was placed on file. The first intimation that a record evening was in prospect came in the 100-yard dash when McDermott, of Tome, flashed through the water in 54 4-5 seconds. The old record was 56

Shortly after this the roar of the gun started the 100-yard breaststroke event, and excitement mounted high as it became apparent that another mark was in danger. Massanutten took possesion of this race, winning three of the four places as Jacobson, the winner, negotiated the distance in 1 minute 7 4-5 seconds, which lowered the old record of 1 minute 11 3-5 seconds by a wide

margin. The final record to go by the boards came during the swimming of the 300yard medley relay. A fine Tome team stepped up the tempo in this event, with Rizzo, Davidson and McDermott beating the water into a steaming vapor to win in the sparkling time of 3 minutes 11 4-5 seconds. This knocked off "Monte Carlo Girls" almost 11 seconds from the old record of 3 minutes 22 1-5 seconds held by




