THE BRISTOW-MONDELL AMENDMENT

Vote on Federal Suffrage Measure Postponed Owing to Lack of

The vote on the Bristow-Mondell amendment has again been postponed. It was thought that the vote on the bill would be taken on December 29, but

owing to the absence in the House of so many members who are spending their holidays away from the Capitol, it was impossible to secure a quorum. It is now practically certain that the question will be brought up some time during the second week in January, and in the meantime all possible pressure must be brought to bear upon the Maryland Representatives in Congress

EVERY COUNTY AND CITY LEAGUE should pass special resolutions urging the representatives to cast their votes in favor of the amendment, and EVFRY suffragist in the State should write TODAY to the members from Maryland. A telegram will bear more weight, but a letter will have very good effect.
