FARM Life.

Address of Henry C. Mallowell Before the Fallston Farmers' Club.

Mr. Henry C. Hallowell, of Montgomery county, delivered an interesting and suggestive address on Farm Life, before the Fallston and Montgomery Clubs, in the hall over Moore Bros', store, Fallston, last Friday night.

Mr. Hallowell traced a remarkable uniformity in the agricultural progress of Harford and Montgomery counties. Both have passed through times of poverty and desolation and share now in a reasonable degree of prosperity. If a merchant went on year after year without balancing his books his store would soon be for rent. The truth is, the farmer lives in spite of himself. When hard times come farmers can reduce their expenses but the merchant must keep up a certain degree of expense. Farmers can add to their incomes by allowing nothing to go to waste and by attention to little things. For instance an immense number of eggs are imported from Holland and England, which ought to be produced There is a great waste of fertilizing material by drainage from the barn yard. If turned into cisterns, pumped out and spread over grass fields it would wonderfully increase their prouctiveness. Farm machinery should be cleanel, oiled and put away when harvest is over.

Farmers owe a debt to the past and particularly to such writers as Ruffin, of Virginia; John S. Skinner and the venerable Samuel Sands, of Maryland. It is our duty to pass on to the future the results of our experience. If we observe a fact do we mention it to the farmer's club or communicate it to our county paper or Farmers as a class are not observant and thoughtful enough. The speaker remembered his astonishment at finding out, by actual measurement, that a horse's head is as long as a flour barrel, and his neck, when erect, not long enough to reach the ground. 
