Location of the Firelands
The Firelands comprise 500,000 acres at the westerly end of the Western Reserve for the benefit of the Revolutionary war sufferers and their heirs. With slight variations in their boundaries, the counties of Huron and Erie, in Ohio, constitute the Firelands.

Made Much Maple Sugar
In the maple sugar regions of Ohio in the early days most of the farmers would make from 1,000 to 2,500 pounds of this product in a season. Three or four hundred pounds was considered a small amount for a season.

Texas, Spanish Territory
Texas was Spanish territory until 1812 when the Mexicans gained their independence of Spain. From 1836 to 1845 it was an independent republic. Its annexation by the United States in 1845 brought on the war with Mexico, through which New Mexico and California were ceded to the United States for \$15,000,000 and assumption by the United States of certain claims of American citizens against Mexico. In 1850 Texas abandoned, for \$10,000,000, her claims to a portion of New Mexico; this was used to pay the debts that the republic of Texas had accumulated.
