MARYLAND'S SIGNER

The name of Charles Carroll of Carrollton is so interwoven with the history of the State of Maryland and Montgomery County that the planned series of celebrations beginning next week, and concluding with the 200th birthday anniversary celebration 1. September is eliciting particular interest here. It has been more than one hundred years since he died, but his patriotic endeavor as a signer of the Declaration of Independence and the points of note associated with the name in all parts of the Free State are as indelibly written on the pages of history as ever.

Maryland people foster their historic traditions and are proud of their great men and the part they have played in building the State. All Marylanders may take justifiable pride in the celebrations of marking the founding of Carroll, the founding o. Washington and Montgomery counties, the city of Cumberland, the city of Hagerstown, the Battle of Antietam, the making of the Constitution of the United States and the anniversary of the birth of

The celebrations May 30 and those that follow will take the form of meetings, drills, fairs, pageants and other colorful events. These celebrations will in-

of the county which is now Carroll County, in the early day, as many of the early movements were in favor of naming it Westminster. It was in 1837 named finally in honor of Charles Carroll of Carrollton.

The 100th celebration of Carroll County, beginwill be pageants, a horse show, a big league ball game, military inspection and drill, an industrial exhibition and an exhibition of antiques.

In its long history this Maryland county has had a history of progress, a record it keeps up today.

The name of Carroll also will be connected with the centennial of Montgomery County. On land part of Carroll's Forest grant the city of Washington was built. It was Carroll's enterprise also that aided George Washington in organizing the Potomac Con. pany, out of which grew the Chesapeake and Ohio

In the beginning Montgomery County was part of Piscataway Parish, as Maryland was then divided into 30 parishes. Later it was part of Prince Georges County and again in 1748 was the lower district of Frederick County. In 1776 the county took the name of Montgomery after Gen. Richard Montgomery who was killed in the American siege of Quebec. Mont-But for the growth of the Federal city the nearby districts of Montgomery County might have formed a great seaport city with the District of Columbia its waterfront territory.

BOOKKEEPING ON THE FARM

Most urban residents think the farmer an easygoing fellow, with little knowledge or interest in business practices and methods, who lives from the land and doesn't involve himself in financial statements or bookkeeping systems.

That picture is rapidly losing verisimilitude. The Farm Credit Administration recently announced that over a million farmers, during the past year and a half, turned in complete financial statements when applying for loans. And, according to the Dairymen's League News, at least a million more farmers kept such records for other reasons. Business methods are as much a part of the operation of a modern farm as a factory.
