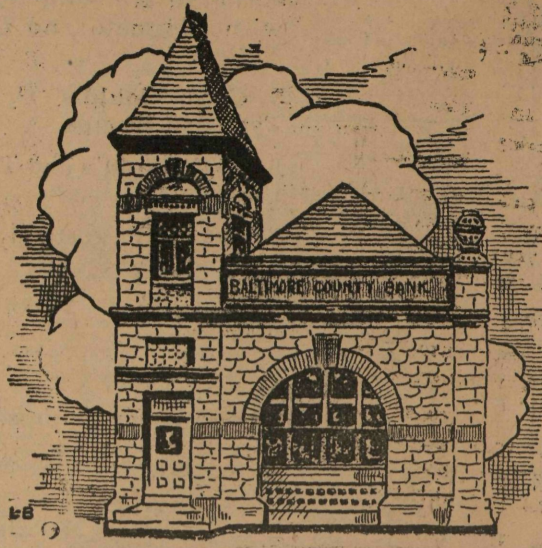


**TOWSON AT A GLANCE**

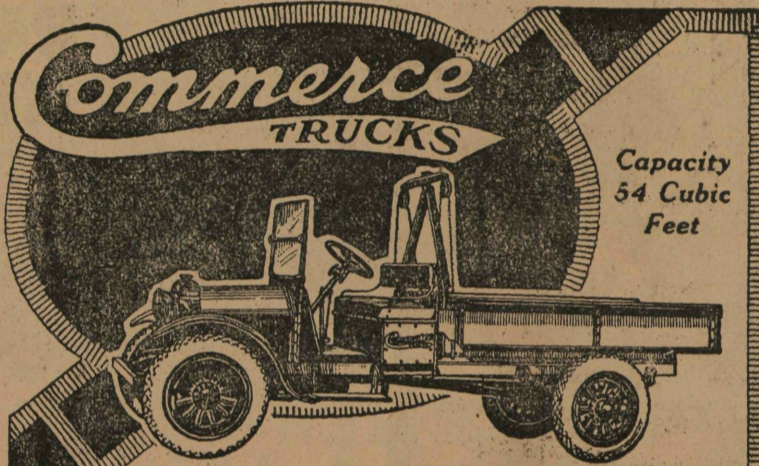

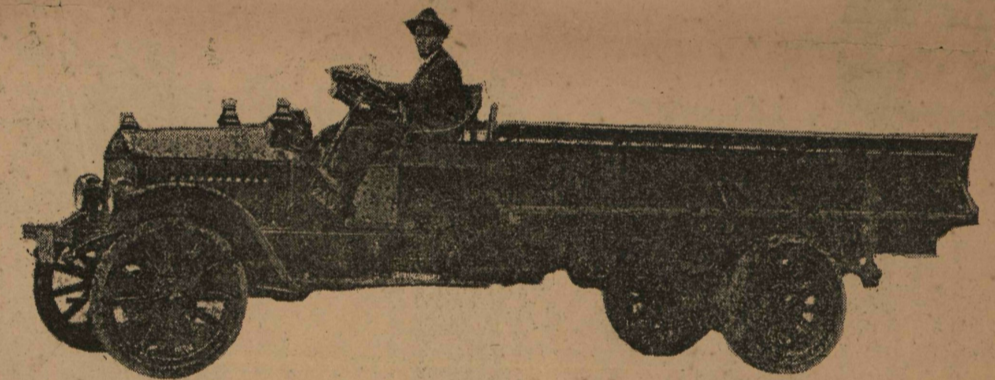

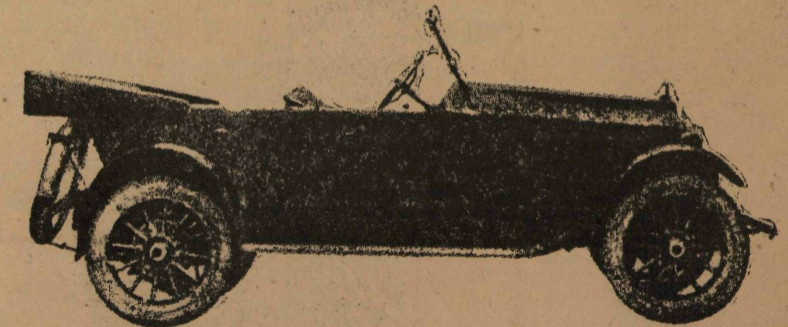
