UPPER MARLBORO, MD (Planter's Advocate)

The Planter's Advocate was established September 3, 1851 and published until October, 1861.

The Planter's Advocate was founded by Thomas J. Turner in 1851. He remained editor and proprietor of the paper until October, 1861. A note in the St. Mary's Beacon, Leonardsown, October 31, 1861, indicates the Planter's Advocate had been banned from the mails. An obituary printed in the Prince Beorg's Enquirer, January 6, 1882, or Mitchael J. Slayman, states Turner fied the area to escape arrest by Federal austrities. The Prince Beorg'is Enquirer.

Publication frequency: weekly

Issues of the Planter's Advocate are from the collections of the Enoch Pratt Free Library and the Maryland Historical Society. Issues from the Pratt were deposited there by the publishers of the Enguirer-Gazette, Upper Mariboro.
