It is construc ted of white pine 1 of an inch thick, and contains an electric engine of 1 horse power and the machinery for working the screw propeller and rudder, which emerge respectively from the bow and stem. open space 20 feet long on the top of the car admits light and air as well as room for the voyager. The car weighs 160 pounds, and fits so snugly beneath the balloon as to entirely control even lits The motive power is two-fold. It con-

sists of a pair of wings, each eight feet square, situated on both sides of the centre of the car, and a propeller or screw at the bow. The wings are hollow in shape, with the concave surface down ward, so as to compress the air and drive the ship upward. The propeller, which can be work-ed up to any degree of speed, is in the form of an Archimedic screw, with two longifeet wide. In reality it pulls the ship through the air instead of propelling it, and in this way gives the voyager entire mastery over the air currents.

When the balloon has been filled with gas and is ready for use, the sustaining power is just equal to that of the gondol

A single flap of the powerful wings sends it thirty feet upward, and thirty flappings, which can be made in about half a minute, sends it to an altitude of one thousand feet. Then the pro peller comes into play. By means of the electric engine and the attendant machinery, it is made 1,200 to 1,500 revolutions per minute, equal to the speed of a lightning express train. 
