Again the ladies went to the aid of the Lodge and by harmonious and steady work and the generous patronage of the public \$366.94 was realized from that enterprise. The success attained was sufficient for the purpose indicated and the Lodge remains to-day in the possession and use with but a few additions, such as Library and pillars, of the furniture provided from the earn ings of the Fair. We who have come into the Lodge since most of these comforts were provided appreciate not a little the advatage of walking into so pleasant a Masonic home.

On Feb. 20th 1882, the first steps were taken by Medairy Lodge looking to the erection of a suitable monument to the memory of Bro. Gen. Otho Holland Williams, founder of Williamsport. An appropriation of \$500 was secured from the State legislature to assist in the work, and the same year a beautiful marble shaft was built by the Lodge over his remains in the cemetery overlooking the historic Potomac as it peacefully flows past the west side of

The lodge has therefore had connected with its history in an official way the names of Gen. Washington & Gen. Williams. By reason of his more exalted stations, American history has conspicuously related the career of Washington, but it will be remembered that Gen. Williams, too, was a "distinguished Patriot and Hero in the armies of the United States" in the war for her independ

In the whole history of Medairy Lodge, including the original membership the accessions have been 100. She has lost in ail that time but seven members by death, viz., Jno. D. Houcke, D. W. Cyester, A. K. Stake, Rev. W. F. Livingston, I. T. Beard. Dr. Scott Gardner and A. J. Rowland, Through the various processes by which one can lose his membership 43 others have gone out, leaving us to day a membership of fifty consisting of 45 Master Masons and five Entered Apprentices.
