One of the passengers observing a bucket in the lee rigging, he jumped over and got it, so that we were enabled to bail out the water. As the brig was sinking very fast, we exerted ourselves to preserve some provisions for our subsistence, but found nothing in the companion excepting a small trunk which contained only a keg of sweetmeats and a few bottles of cordials. There was no time to be lost; we therefore at 9 A. M. committed ourselves to the mercy of Providence. We steered N. N. W. in the hope of falling in with some vessel, for our number consisted of twelve persons, in county of New-York, who shall have been a small boat, without the means of subsist. ence, and without a hat on our heads or a shoe to our feet.
