time I was rejected I super-
filed my papers for the shentum
in 1890 or 1892 either Mr Web
had my papers and another
man of the same name
but this man belonged to another
regiment his name was Benjamin
D Smith of the 139th S. I understood
he had our papers mixed
up I if you look into the
matter you will see what
my pentum was allowed 1891
April the seventh and two
weeks after that I was
rejected then they forwarded
my papers to Benjamin D. Smith
of the 39. If he could get two
witnesses to prove that he
got scribbled up at Fort Mifflin
Williamsburg Va he they would
forward his pentum on to him

For this Benjamin D. Smith
was never up to Williamsburg
Va neither him or his regiment
I Benjamin D. Smith was up
there and scribbled before him
or his regiment Lt B. Baltimore
Mr et B. Webb states that he
would not have any more to
do with my claim so I
dont consider him my attorney
at all for I can produce you
the letter if necessary of his
own signature so he no attorney
if mine he said he would have
no more to do with it
