That he was injured about the month

 slipped, he fell and was caught between
 the wheels and the piece, the weight of
 the Cannon crushing him through the
 breast producing congestion and hemorrh-
 age of the lungs.

That he was, ^{attended} by Dr. Oden and Surgeon
 Mitchell. he was treated at his quarters
 there being contagious diseases in the
 Regimental Hospital, that he remained
 under the care of the above named Physicians
 for about one month, when he was discha-
