"My name is Josiah Cornish I am 73 years old, and I reside in Baltimore, Md. at No. 618 Mc Elheney Street.

I am the claimant for increase of pension under the Act of May 10, 1912. I was born August 8, 1838.

I am pensioned for gunshot wound of left arm, and request that my said claim for pension filed May 14, 1912 be considered for this disability, contracted during the Civil War which renders me unfit for manual labor. I respectfully ask for a pension of \$30 per month.

I hereby appoint LLOYD ODEND'HAL my attorney to prosecute this claim.

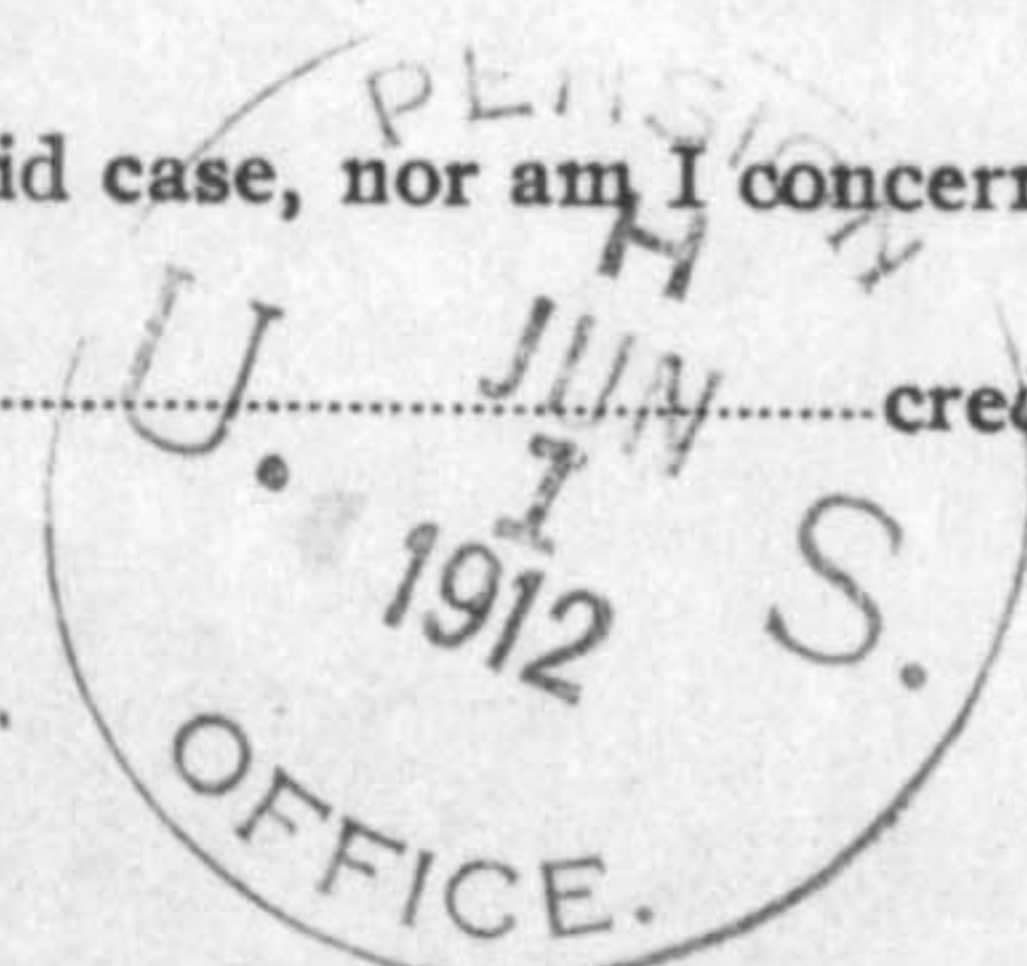
