It appears from the Rolls of U. S. Colored Troops on file in this Office that *George H. Cager* and *Charles J. Jackson* ^{were} enrolled on the *4th* day of *1866*, at *—*, in Co. *"D"*, *4th* Regiment of U. S. Colored *Troops*, to serve *—* years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a *—* on the *—* day of *—*, 1866, at *—*, in Co. *—* Regiment of U. S. Colored *—*, to serve *—* years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. *—* of that Regiment, for the months of *—*, 1866, he is reported

They were present and mustered out of service with Co. "D" May 4th 1866, at Washington, D.C. Muster Roll of Co. for March and April, 1866 not on file. Reg't's Return for the month of March, 1866, indicates that they were present March 31 '66. No evidence of absence March 15th to April 15 '66, on Co. or Reg't's records. Station of Co. covering dates Fort Slocum, D.C. of Reg't Fort Lincoln, D.C.
